The Gospel and Belief by Duane Patton

hen the good news of Jesus' death, burial and resurrection was being published in the first century, those who heard the message were challenged to believe. To the Philippian "jailor" Paul the apostle announced, "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved, and thy house" (Acts 16:31). Many of the Corinthians heard and "believed" the Gospel Paul preached (Acts 18:8). Even from the time Jesus began His earthly ministry the Lord challenged the people to "believe the Gospel" (Mark 1:15). In John's narrative about Jesus we read this sad statement, "among the chief rulers also many believed on him; but because of the Pharisees they did not confess him, lest they should be put out of the synagogue: For they loved the praise of men more than the praise of God" (John 12:42, 43). Obviously, belief in Jesus is closely related to the saving message so that, without it, eternal life is not possible (viz., John 8:24; 17:20, 21; Hebrews 11:6)! In fact, belief in Jesus is so important that Jesus conditioned His proffer of salvation on our first believing in Him as the Savior whom God appointed for all:

"Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name" (John 20:30, 31)

But this begs a question. If belief is essential to salvation, and furthermore, if belief is something we (as flawed humans) are directed by God to do, then isn't belief a human work? While some have tried to "square" this problem by teaching that belief is something God gives men so that they can be saved, Scriptures teach otherwise. Nothing God requires of men to be saved can be identified as a human work which, once performed, earns God's saving favor, or merits His grace. Yet, belief is a work God obligates men to exercise to obtain salvation (John 6:27-29; 20:27; Hebrews 3:12)! The relation between the Gospel and belief is that our belief is part of what the Bible calls "faith" (Ephesians 2:10). So, belief in Jesus is a necessary human response to God's will as revealed by the Gospel. Men do not earn God's favor by belief, but failure to believe will merit death (Romans 6:23).
