The Gospel and Hearing by Duane Patton

In his somewhat lengthy address to Christians in Rome and while writing under the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit, the apostle, Paul, repeatedly emphasized the basis of God's saving grace – that of faith in Jesus, the resurrected Son of God. Luke recorded in the New Testament book of *Acts* multiple occurrences of conversions to Christ. Whereas *Acts* provides substantial evidence for the "conditions" God has set regarding our salvation from sin, the book of Romans lays out the "groundwork" for our eternal peace. As the opening chapter of Paul's writing so indicates,

"I am not ashamed of the gospel of the Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, 'The just shall live by faith'" (Romans 1:16-17, NKJV; cf., 3:21-26).

After fully establishing the literary theme (that of faith in Christ as the basis by which anyone will saved from sin) the apostle reveals the necessary human component of salvation when he wrote, "...faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God" (Romans 10:17). So, while Jesus shed His blood in death, His blood providing the means or agent by which God grants eternal life, He requires of those who would be so saved that they first hear God's message relative to Jesus' saving work. Philip, the evangelist, first preached "the good news about the kingdom of God" to the people of Samaria which led them to belief in Jesus (Acts 8:5, 12). Now, to be sure, no one living today is to audibly hear the message preached directly by Jesus, His apostles, prophets and evangelists in order to be saved; but Paul's statement to those in Rome is nevertheless true today. How do we know? We know because of something else he wrote in another letter around the same time. Note carefully what Paul wrote to the church at Thessalonica on this same matter of faith: "he called you by our gospel, to the obtaining of the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, brethren, stand fast, and hold the traditions which ye have been taught, whether by word, or our epistle..." (2 Thessalonians 2:14-15, KJV; cf., 1 Corinthians 15:11). We should conclude, then, hearing God's word derives from learning the will of God whether spoken or written in accordance with the Scriptures and it is in this manner that all may obtain faith in the good news of Christ!
