The Faith that Saves by Duane Patton

C cripture teaches that without faith "it is impossible to please God" (Hebrews 11:6). Even from such a short passage Uwe can learn much. For example, we learn of the necessity of faith in view of pleasing God, and we also learn that God is one who may be pleased or displeased with us. Consider, too, this following passage from the text just prior to the statement above.

> "...do not cast away your confidence, which has great reward. For you have need of endurance, so that after you have done the will of God, you may receive the promise: 'For yet a little while, And He who is coming will come and will not tarry. Now the just shall live by faith; But if anyone draws back, My soul has no pleasure in him.' But we are not of those who draw back to perdition, but of those who believe to the saving of the soul." (Hebrews 10:35-39)

The writer to the Hebrews previously encouraged saving faith in a series of discussions and examples about the superiority of Jesus Christ over all things in heaven and on earth; specifically, over the Law system given to Israel through Moses. Now, the writer begins to remind the reader of an Old Testament passage that indicates God's displeasure in anyone who turns away from a life of faith in Christ and back to a life of sin. So severe is the consequence of leaving the Lord that the writer employs the word "perdition" – another way of describing the idea of eternal destruction with reference to the soul.

Over the years there has been lots of discussion on whether a child of God once saved by God's grace in Christ can ever so sin / displease God that he or she can again be forever lost. With passages such as the one quoted above one might think the whole idea of the impossibility of apostasy (i.e., a child of God falling from grace so as to be eternally lost) is unscriptural and does not comport with the whole of the Gospel – and if you are one who thinks that, then you are right! We learn from a better study of the biblical text that, in strong opposition to a casual, passive, unscriptural faith, the faith that saves is a living, constant faith in the one whose grace causes our souls to grow stronger with each passing day and in every circumstance of life. With such a faith God is well pleased, and the blood of Christ still flows to cover our daily struggle against the limited, but deadly power of sin (cf., 1 John 2:1-6)!
