The Gospel and Confession by Duane Patton

Thile confession is not the only act of faith associated with God's plan to save mankind from the eternally horrible effects of sin, it is a truly remarkable one. Our Lord taught as much when He announced to the disciples, "Also I say unto you, whosoever shall confess me before men, him shall the Son of man also confess before the angels of God, but the one who denies me before men will be denied before the angels of God" (Luke 12:8, 9). Confession is not to be understood merely as a one-time event since the Christian life is one of constant declaration that of being identified with Jesus. The original word translated into English as "confession" means to acknowledge something or someone. Some Israelite leaders during the life of Jesus refused to acknowledge Him as the Savior whom God provided because they feared that they would lose their constant position of local power (viz., John 9:22; 12:42). Yet, it is Jesus, the confession of our hope, who will forever confess / acknowledge before God the Father those who are His faithful followers (Rev. 3:5, 12, 21).

Maybe one of the most memorable or well-known passages of Scripture mentioning confession as related to salvation is found in Romans 10. There Paul the apostle affirms that when our lives are aligned with the life of Christ and His will for us – when we refuse to deny our faith in Jesus as Lord – we have full assurance of our salvation. Paul wrote that, as a part of the faith we preach, "...if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved" (Romans 10:8, 9). The discerning Bible student understands that God's word about Jesus must be heard and believed, that repentance and baptism are all involved in the conversion process, but also that confession is that simple, yet profound and necessary declaration of what one believes in their heart about the grace of God in Christ. Let us, like the Ethiopian nobleman, not be ashamed of Jesus, but rather, begin our walk with the Lord by confessing, "I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God" (Acts 8:37). It should be no wonder that such a confession of belief was made. After all, as John the apostle has written, "Whosoever believeth that Jesus is the Christ is born of God: and every one that loveth him that begat loveth him also that is begotten of him" (1 John 5:1). Again, while confession is not the only act of the faith that saves, it is a remarkable part of the Gospel itself!


