Scripture Reading: Romans 15:5, 6

Return to the Lord by Duane Patton

One of the truly great benefits of being a Christian is the opportunity the Savior gives to each of His disciples to change from failure to success. Those who have never accepted God's grace by faith have the chance to turn away from a lifestyle characterized by sin, but God's children also have that same chance, continually!

Notice that Scripture charges all accountable humans as being culpable before God; and, likewise, all have the ability to be saved from sin by God's constant kindness. A couple passages of Scripture help us to understand this truth. Paul made this point clear when he wrote, "God has committed...all to disobedience, that He might have mercy on all" (Romans 11:32, NKJV), and again, "...there is no partiality with God" (2:11). Peter taught this very thing as it was being applied to the Gentiles. Luke recorded Peter as having said "In truth I perceive that God shows no partiality. But in every nation whoever fears Him and works righteousness is accepted by Him." (Acts 10:34, 35).

Scriptures demonstrate time and again how God's people, although saved from behaviors that once separated them from God and eternal life, sometimes fall back into sin. It may be once or many times. In some cases, the biblical text relates that there have been those among the church who turned completely away from the Lord. Yet, the Scriptures also teach that among those who sin, returning to the Lord by faith is not only possible but promising with regard to forgiveness and restoration of the relationship Christ died to secure. As Peter announced to the Jews who lived prior to and after the cross: "...repent and return, so that your sins may be wiped away, in order that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord (Acts 3:19, NAS). As the prophet Jeremiah cried to Judah of old, "Let's examine and search out our ways, And let's return to the LORD" (Lam. 3:40; cf. Isa. 55:7).


