### How Would You Describe Jesus? by: Duane Patton

To accurately describe someone we would have to get to know that person more than just as a simple acquaintance. The Gospel writers spent much time with Jesus of Nazareth. In fact, they knew Him so well that at one point two of them behaved so much like Him that they got arrested for it (Acts 4:13). One of them, John, later in his ministry wrote to provide the world a narrative that describes Jesus as being more than a mere man. In fact, in John's Gospel narrative, there is a single theme that runs throughout the book: that Jesus is the Son of God, and He gives eternal life to those who commit themselves to Him. (John 20:30, 31). Only the eternal God can grant eternal life!

Well known author, Warren W. Wiersbe in his book entitled "Be Alive" (the first of two books on John's Gospel) explains that, in the first chapter of John, the biblical writer recorded seven names and titles of Jesus that identify Him as eternal God. These are referenced in the Gospel of John as the Word (1:1-3, 14); the Light (1:4-13); the Son of God (1:15-28, 49); the Lamb of God (1:29-34); the Messiah (1:35-42) the King of Israel (1:43-49); and, the Son of Man (1:50-51). On their own, these seven descriptions of Jesus may not seem reveal Jesus as being God. But if we were to explore the Scriptures more thoroughly we would be able to discover that these descriptions are just various ways of evidencing who Jesus really was, is and always will be – the ever-living, ever present eternal Creator, Sustainer and Savior of the world (cf., Ps. 90:2; Jn. 1:1-3, 14; 20:31; Heb. 1:5-12; 7:16, 25; Rev.1:18; 4:9; 5:14; etc.) – a confession Jesus Himself freely and publicly made (John 8:58).

Giving some thought to these things, our lives would be shaped best if we were to strive to be more like Jesus in our thoughts, words and deeds. In fact, the very name "Christian" indicates that we who have committed our lives to Jesus are seeking to behave in such way, from within and without, that when others witness our behavior they may be drawn closer to God – the Light which is reflected in us providing some clear pathway to the knowledge of God's goodness (cf., **Matt. 5:14; Proverbs 4:18**). For this reason, John the apostle would later write in another, much shorter letter, "walk in the light, as [Jesus] is in the light" (**1 Jn. 1:7**). Difficult as it may be to behave more like Jesus with each passing moment, conforming to the sinful world around us will only lead us down a dark path ending in eternal death (**Romans 2:3-11; 6:23**). 
