Scripture Reading: Psalms 104:1

Glad Tidings of Good Things by Duane Patton

A tor about the time of Jesus' birth, certain shepherds were visited at night by an angel of the Lord. The angel announced the arrival of the world's Savior. Today, we can read of this strange but true account of this event as it has been faithfully recorded and preserved in Luke 2:8-11

"Now there were in the same country shepherds living out in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. And behold, an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were greatly afraid. Then the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid, for behold, **I bring you good tidings of great joy which will be to all people**. For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.'" (NKJV, emphasis mine, DP)

Immediately afterward, another amazing event happened. We read that "...suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying: 'Glory to God in the highest, And on earth peace, goodwill toward men!'" (**vv.13, 14**). The shepherds were so awe-struck at this supernatural news that they immediately traveled to Bethlehem because, in their own words, they wanted to "see this thing that has come to pass, which the Lord has made known to us" (**v. 15**). They saw the infant Jesus and afterward began telling others "...the saying which was told them concerning this Child" (**v. 17**). So joyful about all of this good news were the Shepherds that, as they returned to their fields, they began "glorifying and praising God for all the things that they had heard and seen, as it was told them" (**v.20**).

The angel, Gabriel, earlier informed the father of John the immerser that God sent him "to speak to you and bring you these glad tidings" (**Luke 1:19**). The apostle Paul wrote that the preaching of the gospel of peace is related to "glad tidings of good things" (**Romans 10:15**). Salvation from sin, fellowship with God, citizenship in the eternal, heavenly kingdom with those of like-precious faith are all part of what Scripture identifies as "glad tidings of good things." This is the kind of news that the world needs to hear. Let's announce it!
