Our Senior Pastor, Part 2 by Duane Patton

The previous article pointed out that the New Testament offers no support for the role or title of "senior pastor" in the local church. However, as the Bible student reads through the text of the New Testament Scripture, one will discover such a title and role being attributed to someone! But who? Here are the words of Peter as he wrote to encourage the leadership of the local churches:

The elders who are among you I exhort, I who am a fellow elder and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, and also a partaker of the glory that will be revealed: Shepherd the flock of God which is among you, serving as overseers, not by compulsion but willingly, not for dishonest gain but eagerly; nor as being lords over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock; and when *the Chief Shepherd* appears, you will receive the crown of glory that does not fade away" (1 Peter 5:1-4, NKJV, emphasis added, DP)

According to at least one official spokesman of the New Testament, there is only one "senior pastor" who leads not just one congregation but who is the head of all who belong to Him. While multiple qualified men are to "pastor" God's flock (lit. serve as a shepherd, one who guards, guides and folds the flock under the direction and by the discretion of Jesus Christ, who is the ultimate overseer of our souls, cf. **1 Peter 2:25**; **Psalms 23:1; Matthew 2:6; Micah 5:2; Isaiah 40:11; John 10:11, 14**). While the word "senior" is not found in the above quoted passage, the idea is certainly there. The word "Chief" is from the original language whose meaning is "to designate the one who is placed over the rest that hold the office" (Strongs NT 757), and it "denotes something as begun by someone, others following: Acts 27:35f" (Winers Grammar, § 65, 7 d.).

After this brief but careful examination, we ought to find that there is no such office in the Lord's church to be held by humans such as is designated and defined by the term "senior pastor." This title and office belongs only to the risen, ruling Lord of eternal glory, Jesus Christ. Let's support and encourage those whose work it is to follow His example until He comes to claim His own (**Hebrews 13:7, 17; 1 Peter 5:4; 1 Corinthians 15:25-28**).
