## Re-Dedication Duane Patton

According to those who've studied it well enough, the period between the writings of Malachi and Matthew covers about four hundred years, the Old Testament Scriptures closing around 397 B.C. This period is sometimes referred to as the "dark period" of Israel's pre-Christian times. This is because during this time there appeared neither a prophet nor an inspired writer. The sad refrain of **Psalms 74:9** seems to indicate as much, "We see not our signs: There is no more any prophet; Neither is there among us any that knoweth how long." It was during these dark days of the Jews that a foreign king, Antiochus Epiphanes (175-163), terrorized the Jews and their ancient faith. As Baxter relates on page 17 in his work *Explore the Book*,

Jerusalem was plundered, the wall torn down, the temple coarsely desecrated, and the population subjected to monstrous cruelties. Thousands were massacred. The women and children were sold into slavery. The temple sacrifices were abolished. The Holy of Holies was rifled and its costly furniture carried away. Jewish religion was banned...a commissioner was appointed to pollute both the temple at Jerusalem and that at Samaria, and to rededicate them, respectively, to Jupiter Olympus and Jupiter Xenius...In 168 B.C. Antiochus caused a sow to be offered on the alter of sacrifice, and then, on the very alter, had a stature erected to Jupiter Olympus."

Three years later, Judas Maccabeus, Jewish military leader of a highly notable resistance movement, captured Jerusalem and refurnished the temple. Then, on December 25<sup>th</sup> (on the very anniversary of its profanation by Antiochus), orthodox sacrifices were reinstituted in what later came to be known as the "Festival of Lights" (viz. **John 10:22**), or "Hanukkah" (fr. Heb. "to dedicate"). Orthodox Jews still observe this special time when the second temple was cleansed from idolatry, the lighting of candles over several days being associated with the event. While Christians are not obligated to celebrate the Jewish-born ritual of Hanukkah, it is interesting to note that Jesus, the "light of the world," is the embodiment of God's *enduring* temple. As Christians, let's rededicate that temple this year and always by reflecting His light in our daily lives (**Matthew 5:14-16**)!
