Let's Just Agree to Disagree by Duane Patton

I'm actually ok with that statement – so long as we are not discussing matters of faith relative to the salvation of the soul! Even then, I would not want to force anyone to accept what I believe about God's saving grace even if what I believed about it aligned with God's will! While, according to the Scriptures, there are just some things pertaining to salvation and sanctification that accountable humans must both accept and act upon to be saved (yes, there is such a thing a truth regarding matters of faith and practice, cf.; John 8:32; John 17:17; Proverbs 23:23; etc.); and, not even the Lord will compel anyone against their own will to embrace Him (John 5:39f; 7:17; Matthew 23:37f; Revelation 22:12-17).

I would like, therefore, to offer the following two suggestions to you, the reader. These are merely suggestions for arriving at more common ground when discussing your faith in Christ with others who may or may not be walking with the Lord. First, begin with the end in mind. What I mean is this. Conversations about God, man, sin, the Bible, Jesus, salvation, the church (its necessity, its organization, worship, etc.,) end-times, Heaven, Hell and so forth are all matters about which we may encounter much disagreement at first. But, do all parties involved in the conversation believe that it is the Lord to whom we must, eventually, all give account (Romans 14:10-12; 2 Corinthians 5:10; Hebrews 4:13)? It may not please me or you that we agree with one another or not, but can we not agree that our mutual goal is to please the Lord? Second, humbly accept that each can learn something from the other and be grateful. For instance, Peter was an apostle, but Paul explained that on at least one occasion, he was guilty of hypocrisy. Later, Peter would refer to the "beloved brother Paul" (Galatians 2:11ff; 2 Peter 3:15). Inversely, Paul considered himself to be the "least of all" apostles, and he recognized his own need to continually grow and stay faithful (1 Corinthians 15:9; 9:27; Galatians 2:20; Philippians 3:12ff). Let's try to remember that there is no such thing as a faithful Christian who is not growing (viz. 2 Peter 3:17, 18). I am thankful for those who, over the years, have lovingly corrected me in matters of faith. I'm thankful that they have been willing to share their beliefs with me so that I may not only understand them better, but dig deeper into the word of God to see if these things are so (Acts 17:11). Wouldn't you agree? "And without faith it is impossible to please God" (Hebrews 11:6)

Rightly Dividing the Word

A weekly synopsis of every book of the Bible with a memory verse designed to increase our faith

2 Kings: Spotlighting much of the prophetic work of both Elijah and Elisha (and some of Isaiah), 2 Kings records the last 65 years of Israel (to the north) and her defeat by Assyria (722/1 B.C.). It also vividly displays, in word pictures, the final 285 years of Judah (to the south) and of her fall to Babylon (606-586 B.C.) The book underscores the tragic results of a divided kingdom (cf., Luke 11:17) and the mostly-miserable lives of 39 kings, 31 of which were all bad (by God's standards for them). Nineteen kings of Israel were rotten and 12 of Judah equally wicked rulers. Although 8 of the 20 in Judah were "good" kings, they were exiled to foreign captivity. In 2 Kings, the kingdom of Israel is both split apart and "spoiled."

This week's memory verse:

"And the king of Babylon smote them, and slew them at Riblah in the land of Hamath. So Judah was carried away out of their land" (2 Kings 25:21, KJV)
