Do This in Remembrance of Me by Duane Patton

Our Lord, Jesus Christ, on the same night He was betrayed, established among His followers the observance of what Scriptures call, the Lord's Supper (see 1 Corinthians 11:20). On that night, during the traditional Passover Feast of the Jews, Jesus instituted something both new and unique for those whose hearts were already and would soon be even closer knit together by faith in Him. Note the following passage.

"...as they were eating, Jesus took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to the disciples and said, 'Take, eat; this is My body.' Then He took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you. For this is My blood of the new covenant, which is shed for many for the remission of sins." (Matthew 26:26-28, NKJV)

Soon after this, Jesus would be tortured and slain, offering His own blood as a sacrifice for the sins of the whole world (**1 John 2:1-3**; cf. **Romans 5:1-5**). One might imagine that such a horrible death as Jesus experienced could not be easily forgotten, especially within the lifetime of those members of the early church! Yet, so important was this holy observance that the apostle, Paul, encouraged the church at Corinth to recall the words of Jesus regarding the supper. In fact, we might not have even known the Lord said the following words except the apostle wrote them in this first letter to the Corinthians. Consider the words of Christ's humble ambassador:

"For I received from the Lord that which I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread; and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, 'This is My body, which is for you; **do this in remembrance of Me**.' In the same way He also took the cup after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in My blood; **do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me**.' For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes" (1 Corinthians 11:23-26, NAS, emph. added, DP).

Over the centuries, men and women have voluntarily offered their lives to secure many human freedoms given by God – freedoms to be enjoyed by all. We ought to be forever grateful for their sacrifices and never take the freedoms we enjoy for granted; not one of them has been easily secured. Moreover, we ought to be even more thankful for the eternal freedom Jesus secured for our souls when He offered up Himself as a payment for our sins (**Hebrews 7:27; 9:12; Ephesians 5:1, 2; Romans 6:23**). Today, and always, let's never forget the love God demonstrated toward us in the sending of His unique Son to be come like us, to destroy sin for us, and to rise from the grave offering hope to all who put their trust in Him! Do this in remembrance of Him!

Esther: The events recorded in Esther occurred in Persia during the reign of Ahasuerus (Xerxes) from 483-473 B.C. Insert these events between Ezra, Chapter's 6 and 7. There is no mention of the name of God in the book. The book of Esther tells of a Jewish orphan who became Queen of Persia and saved the entire Jewish nation from extinction by the wicked plans of a Persian noble named, Haman. If the Hebrew nation had been wiped out of existence at this time (some 500 years prior to Christ coming into the world) this would have changed the eternal destiny of all humans. The bravery of a Hebrew maiden, encouraged by her uncle, Mordecai, helped to prepare the way for the coming of the Lord and Savior of mankind!
