God, Our Heavenly Father by Duane Patton

S criptures teach that God is essentially a spirit being who, in order to exist, is not dependent on anyone or anything outside of Himself (John 4:24; 1:1-3), that He is infinite in all His attributes (e.g., goodness, knowledge, wisdom, power, etc.) and that He is the creator of all living and non-living things (Colossians 1:15, 16). As a matter of further support for this claim, please consider the following passage.

Lord, thou hast been our dwelling place in all generations. Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever thou hadst formed the earth and the world, even from everlasting to everlasting, thou art God. (**Psalms 90:1, 2, KJV**)

Yet, the Scriptures also indicate that God is transcendent (i.e., *beyond the limits of ordinary human experience and comprehension*) and altogether holy (*perfect in every possible way*), He has not so far removed Himself from us that He cannot be touched by our weaknesses. God is not merely our creator with little to no regard to how we might relate to Him, however transcendent and holy He is. In God's divine and eternal wisdom and will, He appears to His earthly creation as our Heavenly Father – the one who gives us life, provides us with security against the diabolical schemes of Satan, delivers us from trouble, and promises to never leave nor forsake those who put their trust in Him (cf., Acts 17:24-26; Ephesians 6:10-13; Hebrews 13:5; John 3:18; cf., Psalms 18:29-30ff). In a very real sense, then, while the One true God is not a human (Numbers 23:19a), He is our Father and wants all people to know Him as such!

Our world needs godly fathers now perhaps more than ever before. We are blessed to have the great examples of faithful fathers who've gone on before us as well as those who are still here. On this Father's Day, 2022, will you take a little time to consider how truly great our God is while at the same time recognize the privilege of being His sons and daughters by faith?

But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name: who were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God.
