Just How Do We Spend Our Time?

Someone once said that although there are many inequalities in everyone's lives, there is one great equalizer: time. To be certain, we all have the same amount of time each day!

We lead busy lives. Setting priorities is a common way that we can get things done in our days and lives that we believe are most important. We would do well to follow the teaching found in Psalms 90:12, "So teach us to number our days, that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom." Those whose work it is to calculate it say that the average life expectancy is 79 years. During that time we spend....

- 26 years sleeping
- 10.4 years on television and entertainment
- 10.3 years working
- 9.5 years fixing our hair, deciding what to wear and shopping
- 4.3 years driving
- 3.7 years eating
- 2 years watching commercials
- 1.5 years in the restroom

Adding it all up still leaves 11.3 years of "discretionary" time. With that in mind, consider now our priorities:

- To read the entire Bible in one year would require 12-15 minutes per day.
- To read the Old Testament in one year would require only 9-10 minutes per day.
- To read the New Testament in one year a mere 3-5 minutes

Setting aside even the smallest amount of time (by comparison) each day for Bible reading will have deep and lasting impact on our lives for the better! Before and after reading Scripture is also good time to pray. Our attitude and interaction among others will surely improve, increasing many opportunities to express our faith in God. Forming new habits takes less than a month. Even though daily Bible reading takes commitment, its effect can last more than a lifetime!
