Born in the House of Bread

Christ was born in Bethlehem. Bethlehem means "The House of Bread." Jesus was not born in the house of royalty, the house of riches, or the house of celebrity.

Jesus was not born in Jerusalem, Rome, Athens, or Alexandria. He was not born in any political, commercial, cultural, educational, or socially significant city. When the Old Testament prophet Micah foretold of His birth, he emphasized its lack of significance. "You, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of you shall come forth to Me the One to be Ruler in Israel, whose goings forth are from of old, from everlasting" (Micah 5:2).

Bread is one of life's most common things; without it man would not survive. God's Son is common in the sense that He is available to all. Without Him, there is no life. He said, "I am the bread of life. He who comes to Me shall never hunger, and he who believes in Me shall never thirst" (John 6:35).

The Infinite came to earth as an infant; He who spans the heavens and holds the ocean in the hollow of His hand condescended to be nourished by a woman's breast. There was no way to save us but by stooping to us. To bring earth up to heaven, He had to bring heaven down to earth.
