Are We Ready?

The idea of being ready is one that fills our daily lives. Putting off until tomorrow what we know we ought to do today is known as procrastination, yet somehow such a delayed action makes it to the top of our "to-do list" more often than many of us might care to admit. Possibly worse still is the all-too-easy criticism of our personal assessment of why others haven't already done X or Y - we seem ever ready for others to do what we consider urgent far more than what we ourselves might do in the same or similar circumstances. However, there are some matters of eminence in which we should all be ready. Here are a few of them:

- I. We should be ready to recognize the God of the Bible as our Creator, Sustainer and Savior: Moses informs us in the first book of the Bible that our world and everything good and perfect in it did not always exist, neither did it create itself. Rather, it began to exist when something timeless, spaceless, immaterial, all powerful, all-good and all-knowing spoke it into existence. That "something" Scripture identifies as God (Genesis 1:1-2; cf., Jas. 1:17; Hebrews 1:1-3; 1 Tim. 2:3; Titus 2:13). A failure to be ready in this matter turns out to be success in things that are bound to fail.
- II. We should be ready to turn away from sinful living, and to embrace a life of love, joy and peace: Looking back on human history one can soon learn of the grievous effects of sin. The first recorded human act of rebellion to God's will resulted in mankind's expulsion from paradise, thrusting mankind into a hostile world filled with difficulties, disease and, ultimately, physical death (see Genesis Ch. 3; cf., 2:15-17; Rom. 5:12). Yet, a change of mind regarding sin is something that leads us back to the life-giving source of goodness missing in the hearts of many people today (Luke 15:11-32). If we are not ready to refuse sinful living, our souls will remain at war with God.
- III. We should be ready to meet the Lord when He returns and to hear Him say to us "Well done!": The hope of every believer is that this world is not all there is. We are among those who invest in heavenly rewards and not merely earthly treasures (Matthew 6:19-22; 1 Peter 1:3-5ff). Part of what makes life both tolerable and enjoyable is the promise of a new heavens and a new earth, a place where we will always be with the Lord, a very comforting thought to be sure (1 Peter 1:13; 2 Peter 3:13; viz. 1 Thess. 4:17,18)! Instead of waiting on things to get better on earth, we ought to prepare now for the heavenly homeland that is "not of this world" (Hebrews 11:13-15; John 8:23; 18:36; 2 Cor. 4:16-5:1; cf., Rom. 8:18f).

There are many things in life we should stop putting off – things that are truly important to the progress and success of our lives. But, let us always be ready to love the Lord, His people and the cause for which Jesus Christ died and rose again. Regarding eternal life, are we ready?
